This year's National Adoption Month theme, "Honoring Youth: Strengthening Pathways for Lasting Bonds," raises awareness about how we can cultivate a support network for youth in foster care that meets their needs, embraces and affirms their identity, and promotes family, community, and cultural connections. This theme recognizes that by honoring every youth and their network, professionals can work toward an adoption journey imbued with meaning and purpose, paving the way for healing, well-being, and long-term stability.

Did you ever wonder if there is a way to adopt a child that is a match with your family? There certainly is! The Adoption Matching Program (AMP) with A Family for ME specializes in exactly this service.

The process involves interested families and available children participating in an intake process that includes questionnaires and meetings with experienced Matching Coordinators.

If you are licensed and interested in enrolling in AMP, please contact your resource unit supervisor or your licensing worker to make a referral. If you still have questions, your licensing worker should be able to help.
